Our return to school after the Christmas holiday has been exciting. We celebrated the 10th anniversary of Three Little Ships on the 25th January. The children had special activities centred round the number 10 and we were pleased to welcome many of you to the

Last term, the Three Little Ships had its annual inspection by the Dutch authorities. Everything was judged to be 'satisfactory to good'. The report is only available in Dutch and it is posted on the website. The financial statements for the Lighthouse and Three Little Ships have also been posted on the websites.

The school was closed for a study day in January and the staff learned how to use a new maths resource called Numicon. The staff also had a study day in February. We used this time for the Class A and Class R teams to evaluate their curriculum, share planning and discuss shared strategies for some of the children. The team from Three Little Ships also evaluated their topic planning and considered some new ways of tracking children's progress. We will be trying out a few ideas in the next couple of months and will then share the successful ones with you.

Three little Ships had a parent open morning on 8th February with a theme of 'technology'. The children demonstrated their skills with wind-up toys, the code-a-pillar, the beebot and more. We hope that this gave you some insights into the activities that the children do at school.






News from Class R
